**Marking with the CROSS the Saving Sign**

When we make the "Sign of the Cross" let it be with thought and care. Instead of small, cramped, furtive gesture that gives no notion of its meaning, let us make it unhurriedly, from forehead to breast, from left shoulder to right shoulder, consciously feeling how it includes the whole of our being:

**Our thoughts, attitudes, body and soul, How it consecrates and sanctifies us.**

It is, after all, the sign of the universe and sign of our redemption. Like the sacraments, it is an outward and visible sign of an inward and spiritual grace.

It is a devotion in which we engage before we pray, so that we may collect and compose ourselves and fix in our minds, hearts and wills upon God, who we approach.

We make it when we finish prayer, so that we may hold fast the gift which we have received from communing with God.

In temptations we sign ourselves to be strengthened, in danger to be protected.

The Cross is signed upon us in baptism and throughout our lives in order that the fullness of God's life may flow into our soul and sanctify our days.

When the occasion permits (as well as a dispenser at home is encouraged) "Holy Water" when used with the Sign of the Cross, because it's one of the Catholic Church's sacramentals, remits venial sin. Invoking this occasion of grace while making the Sign of the Cross, with Holy Water, adding the words: "By this Holy Water and Thy Precious Blood, wash away all my sins, O Lord."

So, make well the "Sign of the Cross", taking time, being conscious of what you are doing. As the holiest of all signs, let it take in your whole being—body, soul, mind, will, thoughts, feelings, you're doing and not-doing, your strengthening and consecration of the whole in the strength of Christ, in the Name of the Triune God.

'There will be scandals in the world, but woe to him through whom they come' (Luke 17:2).

Of course, it is not only a question of immodesty... but also of irreverence and sacrilege, when suggestive styles and scanty attire are worn at church services. It is indeed scandalous and sacrilegious when men are coming to Mass to worship God and have to fight the distraction and the allure of naked legs and bare backs in display around them." - Father William C.
