**SB 128 WITHDRAWN FROM ASSEMBLY HEALTH COMMITTEE VOTE**

We learned late Monday that SB 128, the Doctor Prescribed Suicide bill, was withdrawn from the Assembly Health Committee agenda. The Health Committee had planned to discuss and vote on SB 128 this afternoon. This probably means that there were insufficient votes to pass SB 128 in the Health Committee at this time. We will let you know as more information becomes available.

Meanwhile, we have been in contact with Assembly Member Marc Steinorth (who represents Rancho Cucamonga, Redlands, Loma Linda, Highland, San Bernardino, Mentone, Devore & Lytle). He has taken a position against SB 128. We sincerely appreciate Assembly Member Steinorth’s support of the vulnerable who would be affected by SB 128, the poor, ill, elderly, disabled and immigrants.
