The Assumption of Our Lady

For a Catholic, August immediately suggests the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our model and our spiritual mother. The Church teaches us that after her death the body of the Mother of our Savior was taken (assumed) into heaven to be reunited with her soul in eternal glory. We like to meditate, or should I say, we should meditate about the Assumption because in Mary is fulfilled God’s complete plan for man. The bodies of mortal men will all rise on the last day—we believe in the “resurrection of the dead”. These bodies will be reunited with their souls and will share their lot for all eternity—happiness in heaven or woe in hell.

For Mary, our Lady in Heaven, this has already taken place. After Our Lord, she is the first of the Glorious, she who was strictly mortal like each one of us: she “made it!” We want to follow her. She is our model. She is our hope. She is our star.

Assumed into and enthroned in heaven, Mary is, most of all, our Queen! Her Litany tells us that she is the Queen of All Saints—the Queen of Angels and of men.

It is always a pleasure for me to recommend the making of this age-old, Daily Consecration to Mary:

O Mary, my Queen, my Mother,
I give myself entirely to Thee,
And to show my devotion to Thee,
I consecrate to Thee this day
My eyes, my ears, my mouth, my heart,
my whole being without reserve.

Therefore, Good Mother, as I am Thine own, keep me,
guard me, as Thy property and possession.

This simple, direct little prayer rings so truly on the Feast of the Assumption. It tolls so need fully in our present age.

The Assumption teaches us as no other feast does the need for the **sanctification of our bodies**. For it was the body of Mary that was “taken up”. And our bodies are the prime target of our affluent, material, immodest, immoderate, gluttonous, polluted modern days.

Our columnists, our teachers, our editors, even some of our priests are so verbose about all kinds of complicated remedies and curious theologies. And through these our people are becoming more and more confused and sin more and more “relevant”. I suppose I will be laughed at for suggesting so simple a thing as a return to the spirit of Mary, the Mother of Jesus. Life need not be as complicated as we are making it.

Our Faith is basically simple. Jesus Himself guaranteed the truth of this. He said: “I confess to Thee, O Father, Lord of Heaven and earth, because Thou hast hidden these things from the wise and prudent and has revealed them to little ones.”

An unbelievable transformation would take place if every one of us would daily consecrate himself or herself to Mary. Consecrate one’s soul and body.

Everyone, make the Assumption really meaningful this whole year through, by promising to make the Consecration to Mary a part of your morning prayer, everyday! And to live it while you are still amongst the living!

Modesty

“Our Blessed Mother, in all Her apparitions, is fully covered. At Fatima in 1917 she appeared in a world that was beginning to cut sleeves and necklines and to curtail skirts. Shouldn’t she, the model for girls, also in the 20th century, show some signs of following modern trend? Why doesn’t she give the modern girl a break, and give some sign that she approves of cutting here and there?”

The answer is, because she does *not* approve of the modern trend of uncovering those parts of the body as the chest, upper arms, shoulders and the thighs. She *disapproves*. In fact, she came down from heaven to earth to warn against this disrobing trend.

Listen to what she revealed to little ten year old Jacinta of Fatima, while Jacinta lay dying in a hospital in Lisbon, Portugal in 1920: “Certain fashions will be introduced which will offend Our Divine Lord very much. Those who serve God ought not to follow these fashions. The Church has no fashions. Our Lord is always the same.” And she also revealed to Jacinta that “the sins that lead most souls to hell are the sins of the flesh.”
