For 40 straight days and 40 nights, local volunteers, families and church groups keep a peaceful and prayerful vigil outside a local abortion center. The results have been nothing short of amazing: 10,331 babies saved from abortion since 2007, 118 abortion workers converted, 60 abortion facilities shut down, 650,000+ pro-life Americans praying and fasting for an end to abortion and 17,500 church congregations standing up for life!

The number of abortions are reduced by up to 75% on the days people are standing outside praying and counseling at abortion centers. May God bless you for your participation!

REVIEW YOUR FAITH

How can we honor the saints?

We can honor the saints: first, by imitating their holy lives; second, by praying to them; third, by showing respect to their relics and images.

Imitating the saints does not mean imitating their outward actions, but imitating their virtues. If you imitate a saint who slept on bare boards with no blanket, you might catch pneumonia. Imitate instead his love for penance and do what penance you can.

Praying to the saints means talking with them. God lets them know what we ask them, and they are willing and able to help us. He grants our requests through their prayers to show us how much He loves them.

Respecting their relics and images means not merely showing respect to stone and wood and paper, but to the persons these things represent. Relics and images remind us of the saints whom we would otherwise tend to forget.
