**A Family’s Father, A Leadership Role**

The main thrust of fathers should be for holiness in men and especially in their families. Families are the foundation of Christ’s church in the most basic sense of the word. Yes, we need good Priests, Bishops, and the Hierarchy of the Church, but without followers of Christ, imitators of Christ set before the world; first in the family and then as an example before the whole world. Surely, the mothers must be holy, as our prime example of the Blessed Mother of Christ, but for the moment the men are our concern.

We usually think of men, fathers, as leaders of the home. Providers, protectors, leaders in their own rite, exemplars! Mother is holy, to be sure as support and example, without a double standard, but the father must be! How fortunate is a wife whose husband, the father of their children, is holy!

Yes doubly fortunate are the children who have both a holy father and a devout mother! This Father’s Day, let’s take a closer look at a “holy” father, and let’s have the father look more closely too! We are looking for the kind of Christ-man the children will be drawn to follow.

It seems to me that every father should constantly attempt to build himself into that type of man with individual traits as they appear to the children. Fathers should know too that in this day, that is a tall order, since the wrong, worldly, even sinful example is everywhere. He needs to strive to find the best example and often that is to look back to the roots of Christianity, where the Christ-like example is the brightest. Most often it will also be contrary to the popular notion.

So, from his conversation, actions and conduct, it must be evident that he be a true son of the Catholic Church, using the model of the saints as his guide and not the current vogue of society. He therefore must stand apart to be a man of strong faith! If he is firm in the Catholic Faith, whose teachings, precepts, customs have stood the test of time, matches the encyclicals that have been proclaimed when the society at large has started to deviate from the truth.

The children see the times and occasions of prayer and work of leisure seriously observed by their father; they see a man whose body and soul are upright and built upon the body and soul of Christ, filled with grace and unction, chaste, sober, and mortified, in perfect control of self. They see him make with reverence the Sign of the Cross. They see him often on his knees, a leader in prayer and reading or meditation. His deep faith teaches him and his children to love to spend time in God’s holy church, at Mass, Devotions, whenever these are being performed in the House of God. They are placed first, before other activities or entertainment.

The children see that their father is earnest and sincere and treats all these things according to their true value and dignity and holds their fulfillment with the matter-of-fact respect which they deserve.

They are a normal and necessary part of his life.
