Flag Day, June 14th

June 14th is the Birthday of the Flag of the United States of America.

“Old Glory”—as we call our flag—over two hundred years now. Back in 1777, the first Americans decided to adopt the flag which, according to an old tradition, was made by Betsy Ross at the request of George Washington. At the time, the thirteen colonies were having a hard time in their struggle for freedom (much like today—the health bill that is against freedom and honesty). It is said that the colonists were so poor that Betsy Ross had to use parts of a white shirt, a captain’s blue coat, and her own red petticoat to piece together the flag of the Thirteen Colonies.

The original flag, sewn in Philadelphia, had thirteen stripes and a circle of thirteen stars. Thirty-seven stars have joined the original thirteen. These stars represent the fifty, United States. The present United States flag was finished in 1959, when Alaska and Hawaii, two states far from the US mainland, joined the Union.

The “Stars and Stripes” stand not only for the fifty states, but even more for what our country means to us.

The red stripes are for the courage it took to build America and to be good Americans.

The white stands for the purity and goodness of our lives which make any nation great.

The blue is for the beauty of our country and for the liberty we enjoy.

“Old Glory” flies in all fifty states and in American trust territories (like the Virgin Islands) in the Atlantic—and Guam (six thousand miles west in the Pacific Ocean).

When we see our flag, let us respect it and thank God for all that we receive in this beautiful free country of the grand Old United States of America!

Let us make sure we Thank God, every day for this great blessing, asking for His guidance of our civic leaders, knowing full well that there are those who in their evil pride would like to see this country fail in upholding the high standards our Forefathers lived and died to create under the morality of Christian Faith in God and His Providence.
