The Church teaches us that after her death the body of the Mother of God was taken (assumed) into heaven to be reunited physically with her Son in eternal glory. We like to meditate about the Assumption because in Mary is fulfilled God’s complete plan for mankind. The Church teaches as an article of Faith the bodies of mortal man will rise on the last day-- and so we believe in the "resurrection of the dead." These bodies will be reunited with their souls and will share their lot for all eternity-- happiness in heaven or woe in hell.

This simple, direct little prayer rings so truly on the Feast of the Assumption. It is needed fully today in our present age.

The Assumption teaches us as no other feast does; the need for the sanctification of our bodies. For it was the Body of Mary that was taken up. And our bodies are the prime target of our affluent, material, immodest, immoderate, gluttonous, prideful, etc. modern ways.

August 13th is also a day to reflect upon Mary, when she told three children at Fatima that the world would be introducing fashions that would displease Our Lord, very much; and so it has.

Since so few responded and grew cold to her messages in Fatima, she again came in tears to Akita, Japan to incite as many as possible to respond to the message of Faith.

Pilgrims may choose to visit one or two or even all seven sites during the hour planned for each site. We will begin at 6:30 AM at Our Lady of Guadalupe in San Bernardino and travel by car or by bus (limited space available) to Holy Family (Hesperia, 9:00 AM), St. Catherine of Alexandria (Riverside, 11:00 AM), Our Lady of Guadalupe (Chino, 1:00 PM), St. Catherine of Alexandria (Temecula, 3:30 PM), Sacred Heart (Palm Desert, 6:00 PM) and Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral (San Bernardino, 8:15 PM) for mass. We will spend an hour at each site and participate in different liturgies, prayers and reflections planned by the local Pastor and Parish Ministry teams.

In order to receive a plenary indulgence by visiting one of our pilgrimage churches, Catholics need to fulfill the following conditions:

- Pass through the doors of mercy of the pilgrimage church.
- Make a profession of faith in the church (either the Apostles' or Nicene Creed).
- Pray for the Pope's intentions and the Pope himself.
- Meditate on mercy while receiving Communion during a period; either 20 days before or after visiting the pilgrimage church.
- Participate in the sacrament of penance during a period either 20 days before or after visiting a pilgrimage church.
