**Marriage is a Divine Vocation**

"So God made man in His own image and likeness, made him in the image of God. Man and women both, He created them. And God pronounced His blessing on them: Increase and multiply and fill the earth, and make it yours."

God Himself, in the very beginning, made man and woman, giving them a share in His creative power. One man and one woman were entrusted by God with the task of filling the earth and subduing it. The bible gives us, in a few brief sentences, a picture of marriage as an illustration of divine origin, not only tolerated, but positively willed by God as the source of the fundamental constitutive elements of society: the family. One man and one woman were to become one flesh and from their union other lives would spring; together husband and wife would work to build up a society. They would educate their children and prepare them to assume their own responsibilities.

God created man and woman for eternal life, for holiness. Marriage was part of God's plan for them well before Original Sin upset the Order established by the Creator. Therefore, marriage is a true vocation: the path to holiness marked out by God for the majority of men and women. In the course of time, the thorns and thistles of sin invaded this path and made it difficult to follow, until Jesus Christ restored it to its original purity.

In the parable of the Great Supper, Christ taught that marriage cannot be taken as an excuse to neglect God's call to Holiness. Years later St. Paul would remind Christians: Marriage, in every way must be held in honor, and the marriage bed kept free from the stain of sin. Over fornication and adultery, God would call each one of us to account.

Because marriage is holy it requires a preparation, a training in holiness, for husband and wife to live up to their vocation. Because it involves complete self-giving, each person has to guard his or her own body and heart, to preserve their integrity, so that they can be offered to the spouse as an unspoiled gift of lasting value. In a word, they must come to the understanding of the true meaning of love as God has instituted it--not as the world has perverted it.
