Visit to the Blessed Sacrament

Do I seek Christ's presence? His companionship everywhere?
Is He the King and Center of my Heart?
Is He the beginning; does He have first place in all things with me?
He is present in His Word that I should read and reread; He is present in the liturgy, where others are gathered with me; He is joined with me as food and life in Holy Communion.

He is in the tabernacle in our churches and chapels awaiting my visit in the still hours. Do I seek His presence?

I have been shocked by a spirit of activism in interpreting the spiritual life in our days. I have heard people, sisters, priests, speak critically of too much time spent in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, in the weekly Holy Hour, in private prayer and meditations; speaking critically in the spirit that today action is needed, that time is all too short for these devotions, so they say.

Some also say---see and seek Christ in others always and thereby prove your love for Christ by busying yourself constantly with the welfare and happiness of others.

How, honestly can I continue to have great love for Christ and see Him in others, in the unfortunate, unless I spend time with Him---planning with Him---sometimes just listening and other times conscious of His disapproval.

He is there in the Mass when there is little time for personal private meditation; but He is there also in the tabernacle when I have time to listen to Him and speak with Him.

Have a lively faith and keep a sense of the supernatural. See Christ in all others, yes, but also seek His presence as often as you can in Holy Mass and Holy Communion and in the tabernacle where He awaits your personal visit, where He wants to hear your joy, your sorrow, your problems, your love. Seek Him further in Benediction and in public Holy periods of public veneration of the Blessed Sacrament.

He is always with you, but this lively faith needs the strength that comes from personal association also on your part.
